OFFICE ORDER

Whereas, in pursuance of the directions issued by the National Executive Committee, Government of India under the Disaster Management Act, 2005 the Government Odisha, vide Order No.3057/R&DM(DM) dated 01.06.2020, had extended the lock down till midnight of 30.06.2020;

And Whereas, in pursuance of the directions of the National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA), the Nation Executive Committee, in exercise of the power conferred under Section 10(2)(1) of the Disaster Management Act,2005 has issued revised guidelines vide Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India Order No.40-3/2020-DM-I(A) dated 29.06.2020 to extend the lockdown in Containment Zones up to 31.07.2020 and to re-open more activities in a calibrated manner in areas outside Containment Zones;

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the State Government Order No.3856/R&DM(DM) dated 30.06.2020 the lockdown has been extended until midnight of 31.07.2020 as per the following stipulations:

1. This order will come into force with effect from 01.07.2020.

2. State COVID Management Guideline

The State COVID Management Guideline is based on:

- a) De-centralised management: empowering the COVID Management Committee in urban and rural areas, headed by the Ward Members for surveillance, monitoring and containing the spread of the infection
- b) Establishment and management of COVID Care Homes (CCH) at Gram panchayat (GP) level by Sarpanches for isolation and treatment of symptomatic cases
- c) Continuance of Temporary Medical Camps (TMCs) for a cluster of GPs for quarantining of returnees
- d) COVID Audit of Government and Private offices and obligation of the head of the office under Disaster Management Act, 2005 for enforcing physical distancing and mask wearing
- e) Strict enforcement of social distancing, mask wearing and spitting regulation in all public places
- f) Strict adherence of COVID SOP by all Private Hospitals.
- g) Monitoring of travelers from hot spots outside the State.

3. Lockdown limited to Containment Zones

- In the Containment Zones and Buffer Zones, only essential activates shall be allowed.
- There shall be strict perimeter control to ensure that there is no movement of people in or out of these zones, except for medical emergencies and for maintaining supply of essential goods and services.
- There shall be intensive contact tracing, house-to-house surveillance, and other clinical interventions, as required.

4. Regulation of activities in areas outside the Containment Zones

- a. The following establishments/ activities will continue to remain closed till 31 July, 2020:
 - (i) Religious places/ places of worship for public.
 - (ii) Shopping malls
 - (iii) Cinema halls, gymnasiums, swimming pools, entertainment parks, theatres, bars and auditoriums, assembly halls and similar places.
 - (iv) Social/ political/ sports/ entertainment/ academic /cultural /religious functions and other large congregations.
 - (v) Schools, colleges, other educational/ training/ coaching institutions, etc. will remain closed for purpose of teaching till 31st August, 2020. However, conduct of examinations and evaluation, etc. shall be permitted.
- b. Hotels will be allowed to operate as per SOPs issued by MoHFW, Government of India. Restaurant service will be open only for in-house guests.

Restaurants and Hotels are permitted for home delivery/ takeaways of food and Dhabas along National and State Highways/Major roads for takeaway only.

Activities permitted:

All other activities (except for the above mentioned activities) are allowed in the entire Gajapati district within the timeline from <u>7.00 AM to 02.00 PM</u> with effect from 01.07.2020 subject to Standard Operating Procedure of Social Distancing, use of mask, prohibition of spitting in public place and proper hygienic practices.

5. Night Curfew

The movement of individuals for all non-essential activities shall remain strictly prohibited between 9.00PM to 5.00 AM.

6. Weekend Shutdown

The State Government has adopted a graded approach and imposed <u>Weekend Shutdown on all Saturdays and Sundays in the month of July in Gajapati District</u> for restriction on mobility and congregation in the interest of the containment of spread of the disease.

During the shutdown only the following activates shall be allowed:

- Medical Establishments (Hospitals, Clinics, Nursing Homes, medicine stores) and
 Movement of Ambulance and all medical personnel.
- Office of Collector, Sub-Collector and Tahasil / Block offices.
- Police / Municipality / Fire Offices /RWS&S / PHED/ South-Co offices.
- All Government offices with minimal attendance except in exigency.
- Telecom services.
- · Petrol Pumps.

- Print and electronic media identified by DI&PRO, Gajapati & District Police.
- Water supply, sanitation and sewerage workers.
- Electricity supply and distribution.
- Movement of goods and goods carriers, whether loaded or unloaded.
- Movement of any person in case of medical or other emergency.
- LPG distribution, home delivery of cooking gas and associated facilities, personnel and vehicular movement
- Funerals with the permission of the local authority
- Newspaper hawkers are allowed between 5 AM to 8 AM only.

7. Directives for COVID-19 Management

- a. Face coverings: Wearing of face cover is compulsory in public places; in workplaces; and during transport.
- b. Social distancing: Individuals must maintain a minimum distance of 6 feet in public places.
- c. Shops will ensure physical distancing among customers. The owner of the shop shall be liable for anyviolation.
- d. Salons, Spas, Beauty Parlours and Barber shops shall ensure all safety precautions, disinfection and sanitization before and after service of each customer.
- e. Gatherings: Public gatherings/ congregations of more than 7 persons are prohibited.
- f. Marriage related gatherings: Number of guests not to exceed 50.
- g. Funeral / last rites related gatherings: Number of persons not to exceed 20.
- h. Spitting in public places will be punishable with fine, as prescribed in accordance with laws, rules or regulations.
- i. Consumption of liquor, paan, gutka, tobacco etc. in public places is prohibited.
- j. Staggering of work/ business hours will be followed in offices, work places and industrial & commercial establishments.

- k. **Screening & hygiene**: Provision for thermal scanning, hand wash and sanitizer will be made at all entry and exit points and common areas.
- I. Frequent sanitization of entire workplace, common facilities and all points which come into human contact e.g. door handles, etc., will be ensured, including between shifts.

8. Unrestricted movement of persons and goods

- (i) There shall be no restriction on inter-State and intra-State movement of persons and goods. No permission/ approval/ e-permit will be required for such movements.
- (ii) Intra-State Buses, Taxis (including cabs), Auto Rickshaws and other Passenger Vehicles, are allowed to operate with up to sitting capacity of the vehicle, as mentioned in the Registration Certificate.

9. Safety and Protection of vulnerable persons:

The persons above 65 years of age, persons with co-morbidities, pregnant women and children below the age of 10 years, shall stay at home, except for essential and health purposes till 31st Aug 2020.

10. Aarogya Setu

- i. Aarogya Setu enables early identification of potentials risk of infection, and thus acts as a shield for individuals and community.
- ii. It is advised that all individuals shall install the Aarogya Setu application on compatible mobile phones and shall regularly update their health status on the app. This will facilitate timely provision of medical attention to those individuals who are at risk.

All the standard operating protocol issued by the MHA, Government of India / State Government shall continue to operate.

The guidelines relating to lockdown shall be strictly enforced. Any person violating lockdown measures and the national directives of COVID-19 management shall be liable for prosecution as per the provisions of section 51 to 60 of the Disaster Management Act, 2005 and the COVID-19 regulations, 2020, besides legal action u/s 188 of the IPC and other legal provisions as applicable.
